

and each section of this chapter that is violated shall also constitute a separate offense. Any copartner of any partnership or any officer of any firm or corporation convicted of violation of this chapter may be imprisoned on behalf of said partnership, firm or corporation in accordance herewith. This provision is exclusive of any and all insurance damages issues.

- A. Person seeking for the purpose of clearing and grading of waste such as stumps, trees and stumps shall be required to obtain a controlled burn permit from the Township.
- B. The Board of Supervisors shall have the right to grant the permit on a case-by-case basis upon safety considerations and any special conditions as necessary.
- C. No outdoor fire shall be left unattended at any time.
- D. Fires may be set and maintained as controlled burn sites between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.
- E. Candles and noncombustible items (for example, food warmers, stoves, camp stoves, heaters, etc.) may never be disposed of by burning.
- F. Controlled burn fires must be constantly extinguished at 8:00 p.m.
- G. No controlled burn fire shall be left unattended.
- H. Prior to the setting of any controlled burn each day, the person or persons to whom the permit was issued shall contact the Township and advise the time for which the fire shall be set and the time for which the fire shall be extinguished. The Township will then notify 911 on a daily basis.
- I. A copy of the approved controlled burn application shall be submitted by the Township to the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), DEP Air Quality staff also has the right to state permit concerns and require the application of certain procedures as deemed detrimental to public health and safety.

§ 47-9. Additional regulations for vegetation areas.

Any vegetation area within East Franklin Township may develop further rules and regulations relating to planting, pruning, equipment, and related activities that are not in contradiction with these provisions.

§ 47-10. Violations and penalties.

Any person who violates or permits a violation of this chapter shall, upon conviction in a summary proceeding before a District Justice under the provisions of the Summary Criminal Procedure, be guilty of a summary offense and shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000, plus costs of prosecution, in default of payment thereof, the defendant may be sentenced to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 90 days. Each day or portion thereof that such violation continues or is permitted to continue shall constitute a separate offense.
